**RESEARCH EXPERIENCE**

My research focuses on evaluating the impact of public and commercial policies on consumer financial decisions, with emphasis on over-indebtedness and problematic consumption. I employ causal methods (randomized experiments, synthetic control, difference-in-differences, survival analysis, causal forest) and traditional machine learning techniques applied to large administrative databases.

**Featured Research Projects**

**Evaluation of Public Procurement Modernization Law** | ChileCompra, DIPRES, U. Chile (2025)

- We evaluate the impact of Law 21.634 on SME participation and regional development in government procurement through panel data analysis of public transactions and surveys of suppliers and purchasers.
- I participate in the design and implementation of a randomized controlled trial (RCT) of an AI agent application that assists purchasers and suppliers in public procurement processes.
- Collaborators: Marcelo Olivares (UCHile), Ana María Montoya (UAI), Paul Gertler (UC Berkeley).

**First Latin American study of casino self-exclusions** | CMF, SCJ, U. Chile (2024-2025)

- We analyze self-exclusion and revocation patterns in brick-and-mortar casinos using survival analysis with time-dependent covariates, traditional statistical analyses, and quasi-experimental designs (RDD).
- First analysis of self-exclusions and behavioral patterns of self-excluded individuals in Chile (2019-2024). We identify strategies used by self-excluded individuals to return to casino gambling.
- Results presented to SCJ and Responsible Gambling seminars.
- Collaborators: Omar Perez (UCHile), Steve Sharman (King's College London), Mario Sanclemente (SCJ).
- **Impact:** *Paper under review at Journal of International Gambling Studies*; extension in development with CMF.

**Effects of large-scale financial interventions** | National bank and retailer (2024-2025)

- I evaluate the effectiveness of CRM campaigns using experimental data from millions of customers.
- I coordinate with analytics, risk, and marketing teams for experimental design and interpretation of results.
- Collaborators: Daniel Schwartz (UCHile), Abigail Sussman (U. Chicago Booth).
- **Impact:** Paper in preparation focusing on consumer finance.

### **Evaluation of fintech app for debt management | SUSESO, CMF, Destácame, U. Chile (2024-2025)**

- Design, recruitment, implementation, and analysis of RCT with 2,629 participants followed for 12+ months.
- I integrate financial data (CMF), medical leave records (Achs), and mental health data (proprietary surveys).
- I coordinate a multidisciplinary team across 4 institutions (academia, regulators, private sector).
- Collaborators: Daniel Schwartz, Marcelo Olivares (UChile).
- **Impact:** First causal evaluation of fintech tool use for debt reduction in Chilean workers with financial and health outcomes. We contacted over 800,000 workers to help them with their personal finances.

### **Credit card regulatory reform | FONDEF, SERNAC, Ministry of Economy (2022-2023)**

- Design of laboratory experiments to create regulatory reform proposal for offers and payments of digital financial products.
- Methodology: controlled experiments with over 2,500 participants.
- Collaborators: Daniel Schwartz, Marcel Goic (UChile), Denise Laroze (UDD), Rosario Macera (PUC).
- **Impact:** Draft of new regulation for financial institutions, under discussion in parliament.
